This half term, we are learning about Superheroes.

<p>Research</p>	<p>Find out what special powers the people in your family would like to have if they were superheroes. Can you draw a picture of them with these powers?</p>
<p>Creative</p>	<p>Create a superhero bottle jet pack. You can use these instructions to help or make your own.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1  Cover one of the bottles in PVA glue - to do this pour the glue into the paper cups and use paint brushes to get a good layer. Now, stick tin foil around the bottle until it is completely silver. Leave it to dry. 2  For the flame, take some pieces of tissue paper and place them on top of each other in layers. 3  Pick up the layers of tissue paper and cut strips vertically into them, ensuring the cuts do not go right to the top. 4  Gather the sheets of tissue paper together at the top and tape them. Secure this to the inside of the neck of the bottle with more tape. 5  Repeat steps 1-4 with the second bottle so that you have two flaming cylinders for your jetpack. Leave to dry. 6  Cut a length of ribbon that is long enough to wrap around the middle of both bottles. Then secure this with either glue or tape, so that they are held together. 7  Now make some straps for the jetpack! Cut two lengths of the ribbon that are long enough to be worn comfortably as straps. 8  Take the cardboard and cut it so that it does not hang over the edges of the bottle when they are placed on top of it. 9  Use the stapler to attach the straps to the cardboard so that the ends of the ribbon are both overlapping the cardboard on the same side. 10  Use PVA Glue to attach the cardboard to the bottles, so that the ends of the ribbons are hidden. 11  Now decorate the jetpack using coloured foam! Draw and cut out shapes of your choice. Then stick them along the middle strip of ribbon using PVA glue. Make sure your jetpack is completely dry before you start zooming around with it!
