 \star The children will discuss personal space, what sort of physical contact/touch is not acceptable and respecting other people's personal space. They will also look at being respectfully assertive in asking people to respect their space when they feel uncomfortable. They will learn about the concept of privacy and the implications of it for both children and adults; including that it is not always right to keep secrets if they relate to being safe. Children will look at how and why boys and girls' bodies are different and the names for the different body parts. They will look at what happens to the body during puberty.
