Programming B – Repetition in Games

The children will look at the difference between count-controlled and infinite loops, and use their knowledge to modify existing animations and games using repetition. Their final project is to design and create a game which uses repetition, applying stages of programming design throughout.

PE

Games: Football

The children will explore how to apply the principles of attack vs defence, with a particular focus on passing and moving and dribbling. They will learn how to keep possession and eventually score in order to win a modified game.

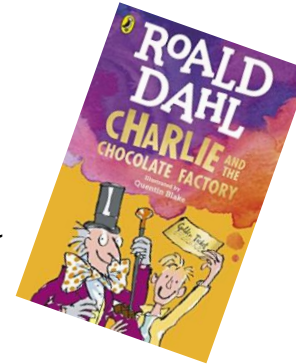
French

The children will recall numbers in French, with generally accurate pronunciation. They will ask and answer a question about their age, and recognise number words.

Where Does our Food Come From?

Pupils will learn global trade, fair practices, food origins, map imports, and local vs. global food debates. Children will consider changes people can make to reduce the negative impact of food production and describe the intentions around trading responsibly.



Art and Design

Sculpture and 3D: Mega Materials

The children will try drawing in an unfamiliar way and take risks in their work. They will use familiar shapes to create simple 3D drawings and describe the shapes they use. The children will make informed choices about their use of tools. They show they are considering alternative ways to display their sculpture when photographing it.

Science

Fossils

Children will be given opportunities to observe replicas of fossils, as well as pictures, to allow them to group fossils and describe their features. Children will discuss what animals and plants in the past may have looked like and compare this to modern-day animals and plants.

PSHE

Rights and Responsibilities

The children will explore the skills they need to develop as they grow up and how they can help the people who help them.

Music

- Composing an 8 bar rhythm and making it in a melody with a backing track.
- Preparing songs for Christmas from around the world
- Learning about the elements of music.

Kingdom of God: When Jesus left, what next?

The children will explore links between the story of the Day of the Pentecost and Christian belief about the Kingdom of God on Earth. They will also learn about what Pentecost means to some Christians now.
