Year 6

- ★ Algebra: simple formulae, sequences, variables
- ★ Measure: metric and imperial measures, conversion, problem-solving.

Year 5

- ★ Fractions (2 & 3): add and subtract. Equivalent fractions.
- ★ Decimals & Percentages: equivalent fractions Daily mental arithmetic sessions.

Science

Circulatory System

★ In this step, children identify that the circulatory system is made up of the heart, blood vessels and blood, and that these work together to circulate blood around the body. They identify types of blood vessel (arteries, veins and capillaries) and their functions. Children will carry out a research enquiry.

Make My Voice Heard

★ Learning art styles, exploring effects with tools, understanding and applying chiaroscuro, and creating symbolic and expressive drawings.

★ Children will develop their skills of hand-eye coordination through learning golf.

Computing

Programming: Sensing

Pupils will be introduced to the micro:bit as an input, process, output device that can be programmed. They will create their own programs, then run their programs on the device. They will use laptop computers to run the microbits and test their programs.

Why does population change?

In this topic, children will identify the most densely and sparsely populated areas & describe the increase in global population over time. They will begin to describe what might influence the environments people live in, define birth and death rates, define migration, discussing push and pull factors. By the end of the unit children will explain why some people have no choice but to leave their homes, understanding causes of climate change and explaining its impact on the global population.

<u>RE</u>

Kingdom of God: What kind of king is Jesus?

★ Children will explain connections between biblical texts and the concept of the Kingdom of God, then consider different possible meanings and interpretations of these. They will make connections and explore how Christians put their beliefs into practice.
