Reversible and Irreversible Changes

 \star In this unit, children are taught to:

- demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes and explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible, including changes associated with burning and the action of acid on bicarbonate of soda.


How did the Maya civilisation compare to the Anglo-Saxons?


Children will comparing features of Maya civilisation with the Anglo Saxons. They will identify challenges facing civilisations, identify similarities between Maya and Anglo Saxon houses, their beliefs and will explain the Maya creation story. They will look at religious differences, plan a Maya city, identifying main features and explain the reasons for the decline of the Maya civilisation.

RE

How do religions help people live through good times and bad times?

Children will make sense of belief, describing ways in which religion guides people to respond to hard and good times. They will identify similarities and differences between beliefs about life after death in 2 religions.
